What is equity in math assessment?

Equity in mathematics learning occurs when teachers ensure that every student has opportunities to engage in challenging mathematics learning, learn worthwhile mathematics, and develop proficiency in working collaboratively with peers to solve challenging problems, along with a strong sense of personal agency and identity as a competent and confident doer of mathematics.

(Strutchens and Silver 2018)
